Moved by Rasmussen, seconded by Haase, to approve Resolution 2020-16-- Adopt Home Investment Intergovernmental Agreement by and between the City of Sioux City, Iowa, the City of South Sioux City, Nebraska, and the City of Dakota City, Nebraska. The parties agree to cooperate to undertake or to assist in undertaking housing assistance activities for the HOME Investment Partnership Program. The City of Sioux City, Iowa, shall serve as the lead entity and all programs funded with HOME Investment Partnership Program funds received as a result of this Agreement shall receive approval from the City of Sioux City, Iowa. The Mayor and Council discussed possible uses of a Community Block Grant (CDBG) which included improving Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) access to City Hall and the Library.
