A word from the City Administrator-

Each month I will review major projects, policies, and discussion items being addressed by the City. For this month's newsletter, I will discuss what occurred in October and what I anticipate will occur in November.

October Council Action Items

On October 3, the Mayor and Council approved Ordinance 959, which regulates the use of storage containers in all zoning districts. Those wanting to use a storage container must first obtain a conditional use permit, which is valid for six months. The issuance of a conditional use permit and any subsequent renewals does require the Planning and Zoning Board's review and the City Council's approval. Each permit application requires a \$100 nonrefundable filing fee. In mid-October, notices were sent to four property owners with storage containers on their property.

Upcoming Council Action Items

The 2018 Street Improvement Project reached final completion in October. Currently, total project costs are being reviewed by the city engineer so that paving assessments can be calculated. The City is also working with Piper Jaffray to secure permanent financing.

The City has received a few questions about the timing of assessment payments. Assessments must first be reviewed by the Council during a public hearing. Notices will be sent to property owners in advance of the assessment hearing date. This notice will include the hearing notice and the anticipated assessment amount. After the assessment hearing, a second notice will be sent to property owners. This notice will include a payment due date, the minimum amount owed for the first payment, the interest rate, and the total assessment owed. Please note that the first payment is due fifty (50) days after the assessment hearing.

The 2017 paving project followed the following schedule: (1) total costs were finalized in November 2017 (2) the assessment hearing notice was sent to affected property owners in December 2017 (3) the assessment hearing was held in January 2018 (4) assessments were due in early March 2018. At this time, I anticipate the current project will adhere to a similar schedule.
